The U. S. C. G. Auxiliary has a Vessel Safety Check Program which assists boaters in conducting a safety inspection on their own boat. The self inspection form can be found at the website: http://SafetySeal.net/GetVSC/.

It's also posted on the bulletin board and forms may be found in the file bins on the wall. After you have completed the self-examination, you can request that one of the CG Auxiliary examiners perform an actual Vessel Safety Check by going to the "I Want a VSC" page and entering your ZIP Code to contact an examiner near you to perform the safety inspection and award you with the safety sticker to display on your boat.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Your \$10/mo Additional Assessment Hard at Work

The **Dredging, Piling and Dock Maintenance Committee** has been hard at work upgrading our Harbor. You have probably noticed the progress on "A" Dock already. Please refer to Kim Arrivee's "Harbor Maintenance" article. The more volunteers the faster "A" Dock will get done and the less man-hours AYC will have to pay out to accomplish that goal. We are rapidly reducing the "A" Dock Fund, but would like to continue to build it back up (with the Additional Assessment) for additional improvements once we accomplish another long-term goal: Upgrading the Power and Water to the docks. But first things first. We are using our Dredging and Harbor Funds for their intended purposes and will have to project ahead to replenish those funds for the future.

We took what appears to be a big hit in May (\$22,400). But we paid off the Bond Notes and are no longer paying 6% interest on money that could only get 1.5% at the most. Our berth and general membership income was on the downslide too. But our Membership Drive has brought in 6 new members just approved by the Board in June and we have 6 more applicants posted on the Board awaiting approval. And we are gradually filling in the empty berths with paying customers. With all those new volunteers we should be able to continue with our Club House, Workshop and Landscaping improvements with minimal expenses going towards outside labor. Sherri is also looking forward to using some of those volunteers to help out when it comes time to assemble mailers etc.

Bottom Line: We still have to be frugal, but the club has turned the corner and I am happy to say I feel comfortable with the turnaround of our finances.

Harbor Maintenance

Aeolian Yacht Club is in the process of completing the maintenance dredging and piling replacement that was started in 2008. As reported in the May 13 General Membership meeting, the process is overly complex due to numerous regulatory requirements. The next major event is the Dredging Material Management Office (DMMO) meeting in San Francisco on July 8. Here, the Army Corps of Engineers, the Bay Conservation and Development Commission and seven other agencies will weigh-in on our dredging plans. The projects are moving ahead as scheduled.

In addition to the dredging and piling work, A-Dock is also being rebuilt. Several head floats (walkways) and fingers damaged during the previous dredging operation need to be replaced before work starts in earnest on the remaining portions of A-Dock. Materials to rebuild the next few floats, including lumber, floats and fasteners, are temporarily being stored in the shop area. Mike Baldwin and volunteer members are rebuilding the floats alongside C-dock, on the dry-dock and eventually outside the shop area.

Members are invited and encouraged to attend the scheduled meetings and functions or just stop by to learn more about their Club's progress on harbor maintenance.
